Palm Sunday April 14th, 2019

Today we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem where he was welcomed by crowds worshiping him crying "Hosanna" (God save us) and laying down palm leaves before him. This day also marks the beginning of Holy Week, where we commemorate the events of Jesus passion, death, and resurrection which brought about our salvation. We know that the crowd's "Hosannas" would soon turn to "crucify"—today our primary reading is Jesus' words to his disciples very shortly after his triumphant entry. The events that follow will show that Jesus is the light of the world and is truly sent by the Father

The Processional Gospel

Luke 19:28~40

²⁸After he had said this, [Jesus] went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

²⁹When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, ³⁰saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" ³²So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴They said, "The Lord needs it." ³⁵Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸saying,

"Blessed is the king
who comes in the name of the Lord!
Peace in heaven,
and glory in the highest heaven!"

³⁹Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." ⁴⁰He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

C: It is right to give God thanks and praise.








Processional Hymn All Glory Laud and Honor (vs 1, 3, 5)
