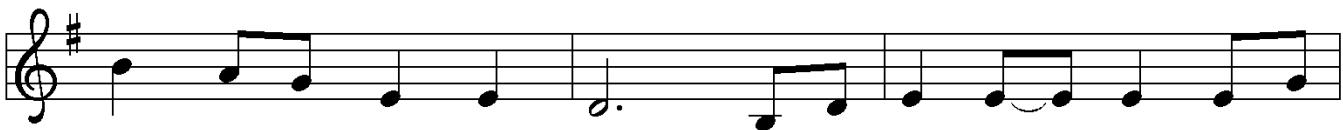

THE MEAL


