## Kitsap Rescue Mission

The Kitsap Rescue Mission exists to assist the homeless and poor of Kitsap County as they work toward restoration of body, mind and spirit through Christ-centered programs.

Ten years ago, two leaders from the Bread of Life Mission in Seattle recognized the need for assisting homeless folks on the Kitsap Peninsula. Kitsap County residents, Larry Cooney & Walt Le Couteur, began to plan for the Mission in Bremerton. On October 23, 2009, the Mission served its first meal. Through the past decade, the mobile meal ministry expanded, two Discipleship Homes for men opened in temporary locations, and then a Winter Dayroom opened in October 2013.

One long-term goal of the Kitsap Rescue

Mission was to provide overnight shelter for homeless men, women & children. In February 2016, they started providing showers (using a mobile shower unit) and shelter seven nights a week. Due to needed repairs to the shelter area, the shelter is currently relocated for the winter to the Salvation Army facility.
