After being born into this world, constant rocking soothes you in the dark nursery with no stimulation...being held tightly in the arms of a loving nurse who grasps your tiny fingers and feeds you warm milk brings security in those first days and weeks of life... it is your only hope and lifeline to a future...

Each week, Julie Harpel rocks babies...infants born with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome at Harrison Medical Center in Silverdale. Of the 2,100 babies who draw their first breath here each year, enough are born with NAS (withdrawal from narcotics in the womb) that a team of volunteer nurses are needed to provide extra loving care. This Level II Special Care Nursery is the only one serving the Kitsap & Olympic peninsula region. Julie began her nursing career in 1969 and yet now in retirement continues to pour her heart into these newborns. They are given an opportunity to thrive because of her expertise & gift of time, indeed wrapping the arms of God around each one.

Julie's love of children and making a difference is seen in many ways. Since 1992, Julie has been SLC's coordinator of gathering supplies for LWR's Personal Care Kits and School Kits. She faithfully serves on the Altar Guild and prepares for Sunday fellowship time each Friday. Julie also volunteers at Emerald Heights Elementary, working with Denyse Hemmersbach's 4/5 classroom.
