The Creeds, Hymns, and Liturgy of the New Testament

Are there creedal statements in the New Testament? Are there hymns that authors of the New Testament wove into their writings? Could there be vestiges of liturgical texts used by the earliest churches embedded in the New Testament?

Yes! But more importantly, what do these creedal statements and hymns tell us about Christ and our mission? It is in vogue these days to try and get behind or before the New Testament writings to get a picture of the first churches but the NT writings actually embody the earliest beliefs of Christ followers and in these hymns and creedal statements we find a clear look at the actual head waters of our faith.

Therefore, for the next couple of months in Pastor Bill's Sunday class, we will closely study these important hymns and creedal statements to understand the early church's convictions and then ask what they have to say to us in our contemporary situation.

These Bible studies will also be complimentary and help prepare us for our visiting scholar, Dr. Troy Troftgruben of Wartburg Seminary, who will conduct this year's Lay School of Theology entitled


LAY SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY Sat. March 21st & Sunday March 22nd

Monthly Treasurer's Update

Below is a 3-year financial comparison of income vs. expenses through December each year. 2019 fiscal trends were marked with unusual highs and lows. Overall giving was at an all-time high, and especially generous during the first half of the year. A decline in giving and higher expenses during the last half of the year resulted in the greatest year end deficit in the past six years, -\$19,490. The Unrestricted Net Assets account, with a balance of \$82,831 at the end of 2019, will be drawn upon to balance the budget and begin 2020 with \$0 deficit. SLC total assets remains strong in the \$300,000 - \$400,000 range and includes a number of well-funded designated and equity accounts. 9.78% of SLC's total 2019 income supported outreach, paying \$78,093 toward benevolences, another all-time high.
