Thanks so much for your help in keeping our pictorial board up to date!

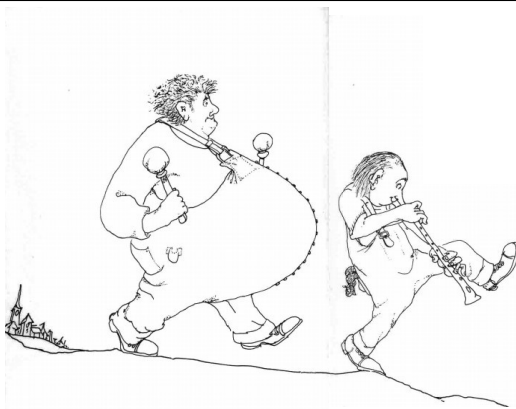

Treat Trail

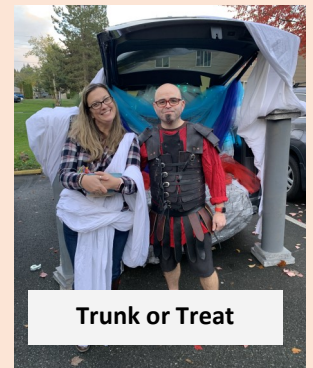

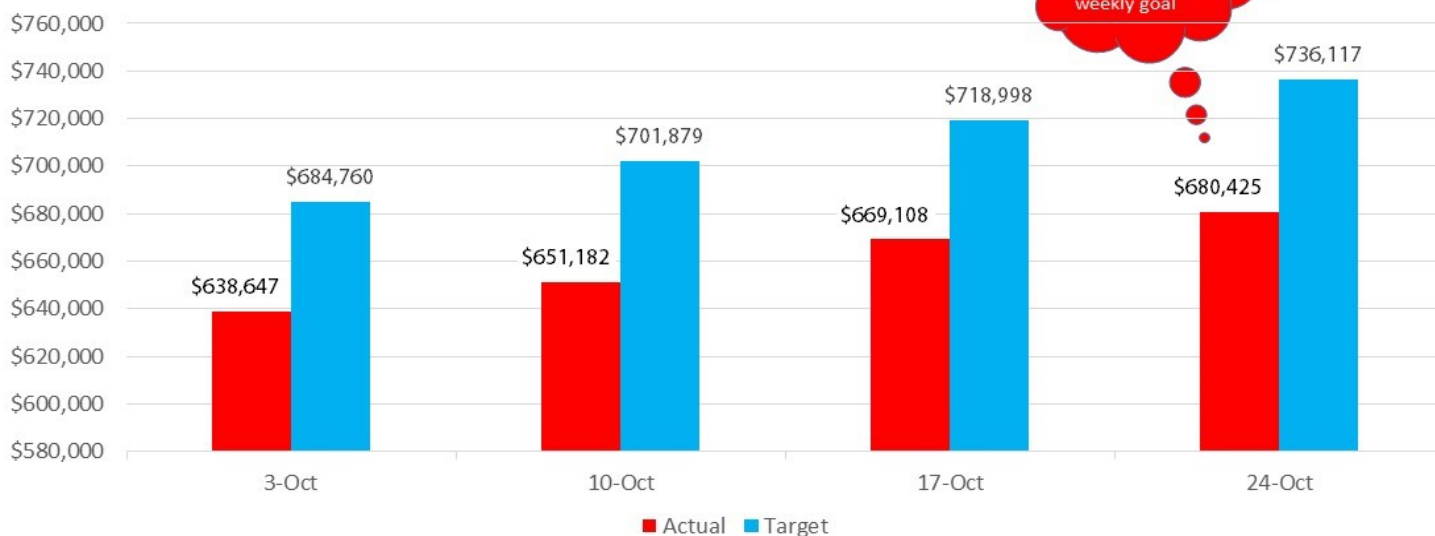

Actual vs Target

Actual = offerings received to date (General/Restricted Funds)

Target = offering goals (execution based on 95% of approved congregation budget)/52 weeks

The above shows us falling short of our offerings target **(\$-55,692)**

Note: SLC expenses are down this year and as a result our current state of giving is meeting our current expenses.



Treasurer Report

Below is a 3-year financial comparison through the end of September of each year. This report reflects calculation and deduction of benevolences on a monthly basis rather than at the end of each quarter when benevolences are actually paid. This gives a better picture regarding our actual financial standing at the end of each month. Maintaining a net income of \$0 and above, month to month, indicates our income is meeting or exceeding expenses.

Overall monthly income for September 2021 was \$68,138. Monthly operation and benevolence expenses for September, \$76,600, was \$8,462 greater than monthly income. Overall net income for 2021 is -\$261. This is the first time the overall net income has been negative in 2021. Offerings for the month of September were solid, averaging \$17,034 per week, including a singular gift of \$10,000. September


expenses exceeded income in part to several out of ordinary expenditures. Current assets equal \$398,725.
