



STIAN BLOCKHUS

forward to exploring different career paths.






ANNABELLE HAVERS

We regret to report that our monthly giving continues to fall short of our ministry commitments. Our expenditures have increased modestly, only \$14103 (3.5 %) more than last year. The problem is that our giving has decreased. As of the end of May, our giving is \$27,879 less than last year leaving us now \$53,272 behind so far this year.



Your Council is very concerned about this short fall as it is much more than what we've experienced before in recent memory. Your leadership is trying to ascertain the reasons for the reduced giving but they are also looking at ways to reduce expenditures, like no more colored Beacons, stopping watering the lawns, not doing some maintenance actions, etc. Also we want to reiterate that some of the projects you have seen being done are not funded by our general fund but through estate gifts or the FEMA security grand that we received. Remember, we do not use memorials, estate gifts, and other designated equity funds to support the ongoing expenses of our ministry. Please consider doing what you can to help us make up this deficit! Also your leadership is always available to receive feedback.
